**Call to Order**

Jane called the meeting to order at 5:35 pm.

**June 24, 2025, MEETING MINUTES**

**Keith made a motion to approve the June 24, 2025, minutes. Motion was seconded by Gary. VOTE: 6-0-0. Motion Passed.**

**CORRESPONDENCE**

- The Committee received a request to provide a letter of support to the Aquatic Resource Mitigation (ARM) Fund application for the proposed removal of the Hadley Falls Dam and associated river restoration submitted by the NH Department of Environmental Services Dam Bureau.

The Committee reviewed the ARM Fund application. Members agreed **not to support the proposal**, noting that removal offers limited ecological benefit, with many unknowns, while the loss of the dam and its impoundment would significantly harm recreation and community life in Goffstown.

**Keith made a motion to send a letter to NH DES in opposition to the removal of the Hadley Falls Dam. The Motion was seconded by Donna.**

**VOTE: 5-0-1. Motion passed. John Magee abstained from the vote.**

- Shoreland Permit Application [2025-01757](#), Sean Gaffney. 160 Reservoir Drive, Weare. Map 201, Lot 119. Expand the yard and additional plantings within the woodland buffer.

John received correspondence from NH DES on a potential permit application within the Piscataquog watershed. John reached out to the applicant to inform them that they are required to send a copy of the permit application to the PRLAC.

## **PERMIT APPLICATION REVIEWS**

- [Special Permit Application 325-318, Division of Pesticide Control.](#)

The Division of Pesticide Control has received a Special Permit application from the NH Dept. of Transportation, Bureau of Bridge Maintenance to use herbicide to control invasive vegetation for bridge maintenance purposes. A number of the bridges proposed under the application fall within designated river corridors.
